REGULATIONS

1.	All animals must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor.
2.	Entries will only be accepted if accompanied by the correct entry fee.
3.	All entries, with the exception of horses and the country home crafts section are to be in the Showground no later than 8.45am and remain until 4.00pm . Country Home Crafts section all entries to be displayed by 6.30pm on Friday evening and to remain until 4.30pm on Saturday.
4.	All animals bought into the Showground shall be subject to the orders, regulations and rules of the Association or Officers appointed by them. Cases of disobedience of orders will be reported to the Committee who reserve the right to disqualify a defaulter.
5.	All animal exhibitors must have adequate third party insurance.
6.	No unsound horse shall be eligible to win a prize.
7.	All horses must have an up to date vaccination for flu. Any that have recently started a course must have had the primary course of two injections prior to the show. At least 6 days should have passed since the last vaccination.
8.	Please note there will be no farrier at the show.
9.	Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding hats (numbers in Horse section) that meet current safety standards and must be worn by children at all times when mounted. Also these safety hats must be worn by all riders when jumping.
10.	In awarding the prizes to the cattle and sheep, the judges will be instructed to take into consideration their relative merits for breeding purposes.
11.	Any person making a false entry or giving a wrong description will be disqualified from taking a prize if awarded, such prize and all lesser prizes in that class, passing to the animals following in order of merit, except in such cases as the Schedule Committee shall decide otherwise.
12.	Exhibitors of Bulls over 10 months of age must ensure that two people accompany the bull at all times when competing or moving the animal to and from the cattle lines to the ring. No bulls born before 1 st January 2023 can be exhibited in the Junior Stockperson Classes.
13.	All cattle entered will be double tied and must be suitably trained. All sheep will be in pens. Gazebos MUST be pinned and weighted down.
14.	The Schedule Committee reserve to themselves the right to withhold any prize, make any alterations they deem necessary and also to settle any protest or dispute that may arise.
15.	Any person making a protest shall, within one hour from the time the class is judged, deposit £5 with the General Secretary and if the protest is not upheld the money shall be forfeited to the Association. Should a protest be lodged relative to the age of any animal the same will be decided by the relevant Society's Herd Book or by the Association's Honorary Veterinary Surgeon and Dentition Rules.
16.	The Association will not be liable for any loss, damage or injury, which persons, stock or exhibits whatsoever may sustain, except where provided for in statute.
17.	The Organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.
18.	The Showground will be open for the reception of implements and equipment on the day before the Show until 8.00pm.

All cattle entries must comply with DEFRA regulations in force at the time of the show.

Liskeard Agricultural Show Holding Number 07/158/8110. All movements must be reported to the British Cattle Movement Service. Details will be sent with passes etc. for those who have entered. (Adhesive labels bearing the show site holding number are available).

All cattle must be double tied. Exhibitors of Bulls over 10 months of age must ensure that two people accompany the bull at all times when competing or moving the animal to and from the cattle lines to the ring. No bulls born before 1st January 2023 can be exhibited in the Junior Stockpersons Classes. Due to the changes to TB pre-movement testing exemptions no cattle can remain on the showground for longer than a 24 hour period.

- The Association will make available to exhibitors a milking bail, kindly supplied by the Dairy Centre Ltd. Please could exhibitors bring their own milking units.
- All cups should be signed for and collected from the Livestock Office after the Grand Parade.
- Would exhibitors please ensure that they enter the "open classes" on the entry form.
- Classes may be amalgamated if there are fewer than three entries in each section. Exhibitors must live within the area marked on the map on page 4 to qualify for the local classes.
- Gazebos **MUST** be pinned and weighted down.

Entry Fees: All classes £4.00 per entry. Show Members £3.50 per entry.

Prizes: 1st £25; 2nd £15; 3rd £10; 4th £5.

(4th prize money will not be awarded in classes for four entries or fewer)

Animals with an average butterfat of less than 3.3% will not be eligible to compete.

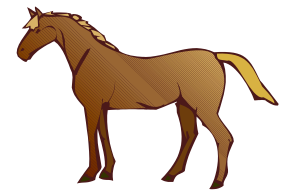

4. With the pony on a LOOSE rein, lead in and out of cones.
5. STILL ON A LOOSE REIN, lead pony onto blue carpet, and halt for three secs, count aloud, then proceed to LARGE CONE.
6. Halt at Large Cone, pick up front foot and hold for three secs, count aloud.
7. Trot from LARGE CONE over white pole.
8. Turn at X and trot back to sawdust circle, leading pony from the OFF SIDE.
9. Halt at circle (outside) and stand pony up as before for inspection.
10. Overall mark for quietness and obedience.

LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION PRESENTS THE RISING STAR SHOWING FINALS

Direct-to-final and semi-final tickets available.

No membership is required to participate in the classes, but BSHA Rising Star membership must be purchased to attend the final.

Performance led: A Show judge and a Conformation judge at the final. Qualifiers will run with a single judge and all participants will complete a timed freestyle show on the day. The judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes.

RULES

Available to amateur members and non members, please see Rule 7 in 2023 BSHA Rulebook.

Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any class at a HOYS Final (not including SFAS, but to include the top three placings in the SEIB R2R Final); and riders not to have competed at HOYS in the current season and two years prior to the current season (not including SFAS).

Open to horse which have never been placed in the top 9 in any RIHS BSHA Open Final at Hickstead.

Competitors do not have to be members to compete in the direct qualifiers, however all competitors who receive their qualification to the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Final must complete their membership and registration with the BSHA within 7 days for this qualification to stand or this will pass down the line

No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional/Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes.

JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.

1. Available to amateur members and non-members.

BSHA Amateur classification

To be classed as a BSHA Amateur, competitors must not:

- Engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity, or as means of deriving a main source of income.
- Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in racing, showing, livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). This does not include the suppliers of ancillary services such as farriers and vets.
- Own/Part own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to riding schools, events centre, stud or livery yard in any capacity, or receive any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment.

For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment.

- Show a Horse owned or sponsored by a company or a commercial firm, or act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, BSHA or otherwise, or a Horse for which his/her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate family concerned.

A member is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Rider in any Open classes, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of Open Working Show Horse and Side Saddle classes, during the current year and the previous year.

If an Amateur wishes to ride/compete on behalf of another Amateur, who is not an immediate family member, then this should be declared with the BSHA office who will decide whether to sanction the request or refer to the board for a decision. (This will not apply if a ride is offered by an Amateur that may have more than one horse in a Championship). If you do not disclose to the office that you ride/compete equines on a regular basis, which you do not stable at home, your Amateur status will be reviewed by the Board, if you ride/compete multiple equines or ride regularly for one or more owners, you could be deemed professional and your amateur status will be revoked. In some instances, a 'Statement of Fact' will be required from the member on request of the Board.

Amateur Owner/Rider: Open to horses owned and ridden by an Amateur, (the rider need not be the owner of the horse). Horses either kept in a professional producer's yard or at home where a full, or part time, groom is employed. A member is not eligible to compete in Amateur Classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Producer or Groom (as deemed by the BSHA) in any OPEN classes, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of open working horse and side saddle classes, during the current year and the previous year. On the day that a horse is competing in Amateur classes, non-amateurs, Professional Producers and Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are NOT allowed to compete the Amateur Exhibit, the same day in ANY classes (BSHA or otherwise). Because of the professional involvement, these horses may not compete in Home Produced Classes. No Professional Producers or Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are allowed to ride, work in (in any form), compete, or enter the ring to groom/strip the horse.

Amateur Home Produced: Open to Horses that are either stabled at Home or in a DIY yard (assisted livery accepted) and which since the 1st of January in the current year, have not been shown by a professional during the current season, or stabled in a professional yard at any time in the current year. To be ridden by an Amateur only. This does not exclude Amateur Home-Produced Riders having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the Horse remains stabled at home. Amateur Home-Produced Horses are eligible for Amateur classes.

No Professional Producers or Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse.

2. Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any class at HOYS (not including SFAS, but to include SEIB R2R); or any open class at RIHS previously or in the current season (2023) and riders not to have competed at HOYS in the three years prior to and including the current season (not including SFAS).

3. No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional / Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes.

4. JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.

Class;

151 Small/Lightweight Hunter: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 158cms, (small hunter not to exceed exceeding 158cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small/Lightweight Hunter Final (date tbc). If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

152 Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 158cms. Capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone). The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star. Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter final (date tbc). If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

153 Lightweight Cob: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying up to 14 stone. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Lightweight Cob Final (date tbc). If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

154 Heavyweight Cob: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying more than 14 stone. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Heavyweight

155 Maxi Cob: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms - to be judged as Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short legged animals of COB type). To be shown hogged. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Maxi Cob Final (insert date). If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

156 Small Riding Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms and not exceeding 158cms. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small Riding Horse Final (date tbc). If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

157 Large Riding Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 158cms. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Large Riding Horse Final (date tbc). If already qualified the

qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified.

158 Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to thoroughbred horses retired from race training. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Racehorse or Show Horse (date tbc). If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. 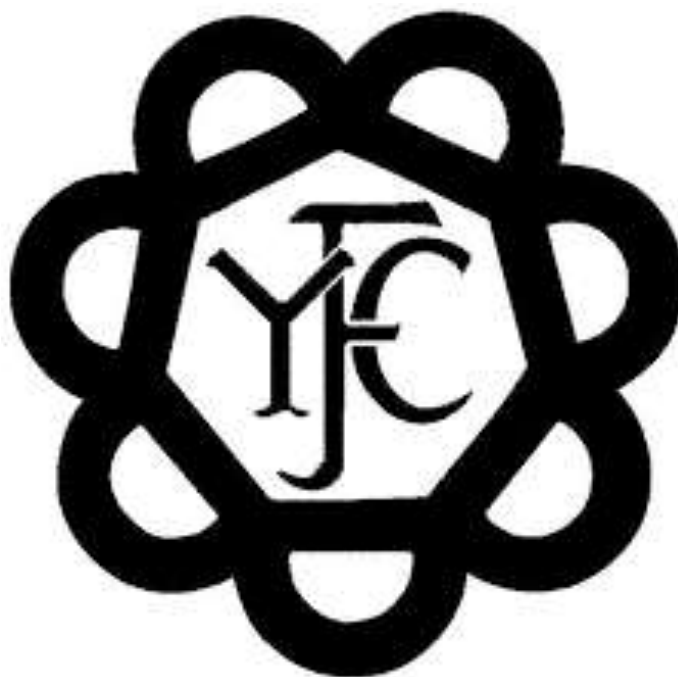

RECIPES

Class: 2 Kelly's Tea bread

Ingredients: 1 cup dried fruit (sultanas, chopped peel and chopped apricots), 1 cup hot tea (2 tea bags squeezed out), 1 cup light brown sugar, 2 cups self raising flour, 1 egg.

Method: Preheat oven (180°C, fan 170°C) Gas 4), 350°F. Soak the fruit in the hot tea for a few minutes, add sugar and cool for 15 minutes. Add flour and beaten egg. Bake for 1 ½ hours in a greased and lined 2 lb loaf tin. Leave to cool for a few minutes then turn out onto a wire rack.

Class: 3 Lemon & Ginger Oat Crunch Cookies (makes about 24)

Ingredients: 225g (8oz) self raising flour, 175g (6 oz) butter, 175g (6oz) demerara sugar), 125g (4oz) oats), 2tbsp golden syrup, pinch salt, 1 tsp ground ginger, zest from 2 lemons and saving some of the lemon juice for mixing with some icing sugar to drizzle on the cookies after cooking.

Method: Preheat oven (180°C, fan 170°C) Gas 4 350°F. Mix the flour, salt, ground ginger and lemon zest in a bowl. Rub in the butter. Add the sugar and oats and syrup and combine together to make a firm dough. Take a teaspoon of dough and roll it into a ball about the size of a walnut and place well apart on lined baking sheets to allow for spreading, flatten each one slightly. Bake for 15-20 minutes until golden brown. Allow to cool slightly then transfer to a cooling wire. Mix the icing sugar with a little of the lemon juice and drizzle on top of the cooled cookies. Store in an airtight container.

Class: 4 Boiled Fruit Cake

Ingredients: 4oz margarine or butter, 6oz caster sugar, 6oz currants, 6oz sultanas, 2oz mixed peel, 8floc water, 1 level tsp bicarbonate of soda, 1 level tsp of mixed spice, 2 large beaten eggs, 4oz plain flour, 4oz self raising flour, pinch of salt.

Method: Preheat oven (140°C, fan 130°C) Gas 1 280°F. In a large saucepan add margarine/butter, caster sugar, dried fruit, mixed peel, water, bicarbonate of soda and mixed spice. Bring to a rolling boil and cook for 1 minute. Cool mixture for 20 minutes stirring often before gradually adding the beaten eggs, followed by the flour and salt. Stir well then turn into a greased and lined 2lb loaf tin. Bake for 1 hour 15 mins or until the cake goes quiet.

Class: 7 Cherry Shortbread Fingers

Ingredients: 100g (4oz) plain flour, 50g (2oz) corn flour, 100g (4oz) butter, 50g (2oz) caster sugar, 50g (2oz) glaze cherries (chopped). Caster sugar to decorate.

Method: Pre heat the oven to (160°C fan 150°C) Gas 3, 325°F. Grease a 17.5cm (7') square tin. Sift together flours a couple of times, cream butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Work in the flours and chopped cherries. Knead well together. Press mixture into tin and bake for approx. 35 minutes until a very pale golden brown. Remove from the oven and sprinkle with caster sugar and mark into 12 fingers. Leave the shortbread to cool in the tin for 10 minutes before transferring to a cooling wire.

Class: 11 Cheese & Chutney Whirls

Ingredients: 125g plain flour, 100g butter (diced and chilled), 100g mature cheddar (or other strong cheese coarsely grated), 1 tablespoon chutney/pickle (finely chopped chutney/pickle for best results), 1 – 2 tablespoons cold water.

Method: Preheat the oven (200°C fan 190°C), Gas 6, 400°F. Line a baking tray with baking parchment. Rub butter into flour until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in cheese and add 1 – 2 tablespoons of cold water. Combine until mixture forms a dough ball. Wrap in cling film and chill in fridge for 20 minutes. Lightly dust a work surface with flour and roll out the pastry into a rough rectangle 20cm x 40 cm, 5mm

thick. Using a spatula spread chutney thinly over the pastry. Roll up the pastry starting from the longest edge to form a log. Using a serrated knife slice evenly into discs about 1cm thick and arrange on a baking sheet. Bake for 15-20 minutes until golden brown. Allow to cool slightly and then transfer onto a cooling rack.
